

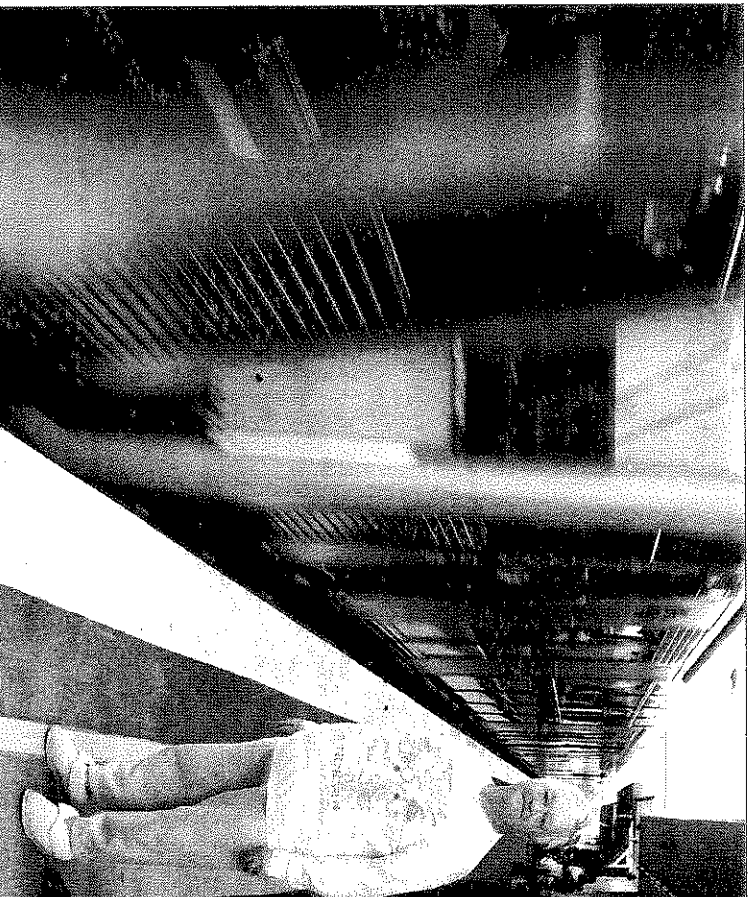

RESIDENT Des Lang has warned that RailCorp's roster review could cause big problems for commuters at Warwick Farm station as it is upgraded.

A RailCorp spokeswoman said the network-wide review would not cost jobs but Mr Lang feared problems will arise if roster shuffling reduced staff in peak periods as commuter numbers increased.

"The long-term plan is to upgrade it and increase the car

park, which will increase the amount of people using the station," he said.

"There will be issues with security and assisting disabled and the elderly. The staff there are extremely good and they know the majority of commuters.

"If the number is cut back it will cause a lot of problems because one person can't be selling tickets and set up the ramp for a disabled person at the same time."

The Rail, Tram and Bus Union has been asking commuters to sign a petition.

CASULA Links Estate residents are continuing the push for noise barriers along the Southern Sydney Freight Line route with a petition for State Parliament.

It will request the Government to take responsibility for reducing train noise and provide sound walls that do not destroy the area's visual amenity.

Greens MP Lee Rhiannon will be

collecting signatures for the petition in the Macquarie Street Mall, Liverpool, on May 21.

It will say that noise from the existing rail line far exceeds the threshold defined by the World Health Organisation.

Bill Cashman, from the Greens, said he hoped the petition would provide some sort of resolution, not only for Casula residents along the rail corridor, but for others whose health is affected by living
